KNOW YOUR MOTHERLAND

National Symbols of India

National Flag: The National Flag is a horizontal tricolour of deep saffron (kesaria) at the top, white in the middle and dark green at the bottom in equal proportion. The ratio of width of the flag to its length is two to three. In the centre of the white band is a navy-blue wheel which represents the Dharma. The top saffron colour, indicates the strength and courage of the country. The white middle band indicates peace and truth with Dharma Chakra. The green shows the fertility, growth and auspiciousness of the land. Its design is that of the wheel which appears on the abacus of the Sarnath Lion Capital of Ashoka. Its diameter approximates to the width of the white band and it has 24 spokes.

National Emblem: The National Emblem of India is a replica of the **Sarnath Lion at the capital of Ashoka**, near Varanasi in Uttar Pradesh. It depicts four lions standing back to back. The emblem symbolizes power, courage and confidence.

National Flower: The National Flower of India is the Lotus. The lotus represents long life, honour, and good fortune. It is also a symbol of triumph, since the lotus is rooted in mud and can survive to regeminate for thousands of years.

National Bird: The National Bird of India is the **Peacock**. Peacocks symbolize grace, pride, and beauty. Peacocks are often used in Indian mythology and folk stories.

National Animal: The National Animal of India is the **Tiger**. It is respected in India for its strength and grace, as well as its incredible power. The Indian tiger is also called the Royal Bengal Tiger.

National Aquatic Animal: **River Dolphin** is the National Aquatic Animal of India. The Ministry of Environment and Forests notified the Ganges River Dolphin as the National Aquatic Animal on 18th May, 2010. This mammal is also said to represent the purity of the holy Ganga as it can only survive in pure and fresh water.

National Fruit: The National Fruit of India is the **Mango**. There are over 100 varieties of mangoes in India, in a range of colours, sizes, and shapes.

National Tree: The National Tree of India is the **Banyan Tree**.

National Sport: The National Sport of India is **Hockey**.

National River: The **Ganga/Ganges** is the longest river of India flowing over 2,510 kms of mountains, valleys and plains. It originates in the snowfields of the Gangotri Glacier in the Himalayas as the Bhagirathi River. It is later joined by other rivers such as the Alaknanda, Yamuna, Son, Gomti, Kosi and Ghaghara. The Ganga river basin is one of the most fertile and densely populated areas of the world and covers an area of 1,000,000 sq. kms.
